

INSTITUTIONS THAT ACCEPT STAT

- Some institutions encourage applicants who do not have any formal educational qualifications to sit STAT as an alternative way of qualifying for admission to tertiary study. You may have to complete additional selection requirements. Refer to the institutions' entries on UAC's website.
- Results from the STAT Multiple Choice are accepted by some institutions as proof of English proficiency. Refer to table 5 - English language proficiency.

Length of time STAT results remain valid

- * 10 year validity The Australian National University and Southern Cross University will accept STAT results obtained after 1997 for 2008 admissions.
 - ** 3 year validity These universities and faculties will accept STAT results obtained after 2004 for 2008 admissions.
- All other institutions without an asterisk (*) do not have a restriction on the length of time STAT results remain valid.
